Working towards impactful grant-making should be mandate #1 for all professional giving organizations—those which have been in some measure subsidized by tax policies and those with the fever for giving back.


The foundation's portfolio has been cautiously allocated and despite this we have managed to grow our corpus > 8.5% over the last 1,3,5 and 7 year



period. In addition, the portfolio's equity sleeve has outperformed the S&P (and the latter has a concentration in large cap tech which we never had nor have).
